
## LESSON 6: LOUISIANA PURCHASE

Abert Gallatin, Secretary of the Theasury of the United States. Whereas by an act, passed the tenth day of Rovember, in the year one thousand eight hundred and three, contithed "An Act authorizing the creation of a stock to the amount of deven million's two hundred and fifty thousand dollars for the peoplose of carrying into effect the Convention of the 30" of April one thousand eight hundred and three, between the United Rates of America, and the French Republic; and making provision for the payment of the same"; it is, among other things enacted That for the purpose of carrying into effect the Convention of the thirtieth day of April 1803 between the United Chates of America and the French Republic, the Secretary of the heading be, and he is hereby, authorized to cause to be constituted Contifica of stock signed by the Register of the Heasury in favor of the Brench Republic or of it's Afsigness, for the sum of Cleven Millions two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, bearing an inter rest of six per centum per annum, from the time when possession of Souisiana shall have been obtained in conformity with the Freaty of the thirtieth day of April 1803, between the United States of ame and the mench Republic, and in other respects conformable with the tenor of the Convention aforesaid; and the President of the United States is authorized to cause the said Certificates of Stock to be delivered to the Government of France, or to such Person or Persons as that be authorized to receive them, in three months at most after the exchange of ratifications of the heaty aforesaid and after Touisiana shall be taken possepsion of in the name of the Government of the United States" Yow therefore Be.

July 4. 1803 , en Sin In the journey which you are about to undertake for the discovery of the interand surce of the Missingin , and of the most convenient with communication from thence to the Pacific ocean, your party being mall, it is to be expected that you vill encounter considerable dangers from the Indian inhabitants . should you escape those sangers and reach the Pacific ocean, you may find it improved to harand a notion the same way , and he fored to seek a papeage mend by see . in such referes as one may find on the Western coast. but you will be eithout money, without clother & they receipteries; as a sufficient supply cannot be carried with you from hence . your resource in that case can only be in the credet of the U.S. for thick prograse I hereby authorise you to draw on the Secretaries of States of the Treasury of War & of the Kary of the U.S. according as you may find your draughts will be most regociable for the purpose of Staining money or receptaries for yourself & your mer : and I solomaly pledge the faith of the Row Led States that these draughts shall be paid junctually at the date they are made payables I also ask of the Consuls agents, merchants Veitisens of any nation with which we have intercourse or amile, to persish you with those sup. . plies which your no efsities may call for , assuring them of honorable and prompt peticities and new own Conarts in foreign parts there you may happon to be, are booky instructed V sequired to be aiding Variating to you in whatever may be realizing for proceeding your velow back to the Waited States. And to give more eatine satisfaction & confidence to those the may be disposed to aid you, I Thomas Sefferson, President of the United States of america, have written this letter of general wedet with my own hand , and signed it with my name . Capt Meriwether Lewis.
